AES Central Region Meeting Recap

Regional meets are open to all AES Members in the US Central Region. Check your notification preferences in your AES account if you are not getting The Loop newsletters from HQ.

At the October 6th AES Central Region Online Meeting, Lesley Fogle brought up an educator's request for guidelines on student internships. Tim Ryan of Webster University offered to share their guidelines; and Justice Bugler mentioned cross-referencing those with the Department of Education guidelines. She also asked the regional sections group if there had been a Student Regional meet or Town Hall, mentioning students who are in programs that don't have an AES Student Section.

Ohio has two student sections at Ohio University and Capital University. It was mentioned that students can affiliate with the professional section as a Student (secondary affiliation if their school has a Student Section). AES Columbus does have affiliate Student Members who live throughout Ohio. Lesley followed up with Colleen Harper about who to talk to regarding experience with student outreach. Colleen mentioned that the Discord server will be launching soon and could be a useful tool for connecting isolated members.

Ultimately the goal is to have our Education Committee be points of contact for local concerns, and develop outreach plans. So far our members in the education community include Josh Antonuccio and Eddie Ashworth (Ohio University), Ryan Van Bibber (Fort Hayes), Neal Schmitt and Chad Loughridge (Capital University), Doc Davis (Otterbein), Andrew Tripp (Oberlin), and Brian Jump (Central State).

The resurrection of the Cincinnati section was also discussed. Ian Corbett (Regional VP) sent an email introduction and we invited the group to hit us up with any questions, join our mailing list and meets, or even elect secondary affiliation with us.

With so many new members and affiliates throughout Ohio, in addition to about 80 subscribers interested in learning more about AES, we would like to coordinate an online Meet & Greet in December.
